To Logan County Campground Operators:

Due to the recent additional second bullet point (as highlighted below) on the exclusion statement for campground closures as contained in the “Ohio Responds to COVID-19 Continued Closures” guidance document from Ohio Governor Mike DeWine through the Ohio Department of Health’s Development Services Agency that now states,

Campgrounds, including recreational camps and recreational vehicle (RV) parks.

- *Excludes people living in campground RVs with no other viable place of residence.*
- *Excludes people living in cabins, mobile homes, or other fixed structures that are meant for single families and where preexisting residential activity already has been established. (E.g., for people who have part-time preestablished residences at campgrounds for the summer months.)*

A further explanation was offered today by the Ohio Department of Health for customers that have a pre-established residence through a lease, deed, or multi-month lease in a campground can remain provided that they still follow all social distancing and CDC guidelines. Transient camping (whether in a tent or an RV) is not permitted at this time.

All campground owners/operators are still requested to forward to the Logan County Health District their re-opening plans for review to show how they are going to limit the spread of the Corona virus such as by keeping closed all public facilities like shelter houses, restrooms and pools.

If you have not already done so, please submit your plans for your camp demonstrating how social distancing will be accomplished to lchd@loganhealth.org. If you have already submitted plans, our staff is currently reviewing them and will follow up with you directly if any further information is required.

All re-opening arrangements are subject to change at any time upon revision of the Stay At Home Order by the Governor’s Office.
