

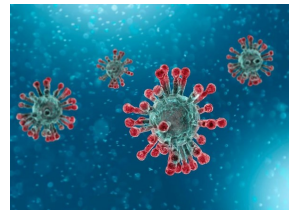

COVID-19 testing for symptomatic individuals with or without a physician order

All symptomatic individuals, or their physician providing the order, must contact the Logan County Health District to obtain COVID-19 testing. The Health District will complete a phone assessment and if warranted, will notify Mary Rutan Hospital to establish an appointment time. Appointments are required. No walk-in testing is allowed. Testing is based on supply availability. Contact the Logan County Health District at 937-592-9040, select option 1.

Mary Rutan Hospital pre-surgical COVID-19 testing

This service is conveniently scheduled for MRH patients in advance of their surgical procedures being performed at Mary Rutan Hospital.

Non-Mary Rutan Hospital pre-surgical COVID-19 testing

For individuals that require pre-surgical COVID-19 testing prior to a surgical procedure that is not being performed at Mary Rutan Hospital. Testing is based on supply availability. An appointment is required. Call 937-651-6619 to schedule an appointment.
